

# Walking the Cornish Celtic Way

## A mini camino

*A personal account by John Hereward*



**Sunday am** I had 2 services as usual followed by a meeting then a baptism. I had my backpack with me at the baptism as visual aid - journey through life - Janet met me and whisked me straight to Newquay for the start of the pilgrimage. A very short walk to Crantock where we stayed the night. Most evenings food was provided by local churches.

**Monday** I went for a little stroll in the am while others were waking. We made our own breakfasts and packed lunches with food provided by the support team. We joined the locals for morning prayer and were joined by day walkers as we set off in the mizzle - our only wet day. The route on this section by and large follows the coast path but with one or two detours eg to visit St Cubert's well on Holywell pitch and put course and St Pirran's oratory near Perranporth. The weather had dried out by the time we reached St Agnes where we stayed in a cavernous church hall. We had almost finished our evening meal when I heard the sound of bells!! I joined their practice night and was warmly welcomed.

**Tuesday** the weather was fine and we had a stunning coastal walk through the industrial landscape of N Cornwall ending at Portreath. Here the modern hall boasted shower facilities so after tracking down a beach shop that sold a towel I was suitably refreshed. One of the group was good at getting us to play simple card / dice games in the evenings.

**Wednesday** we joined with the locals for their mid-week communion and the day walkers - including my brother Les and his wife Helen, swelled our numbers to 19! Another stunning coast walk in perfect walking weather. Slightly marred by a grumpy café owner who told us that the place we were sitting wasn't a picnic area! We altered our plans a bit as the originally planned stop over had a clash with hall bookings. This had the advantage of making Wednesdays not such a long walk but the disadvantage of making Thursday longer!

**Thursday** we went from Gwithian to Ludgvan which is 16 miles. Thankfully not much up and down, firstly along the sands, then round the estuary and over St Michael's way. One of the day walkers has a dairy farm on St Michael's way and had arranged with her husband and his mother to provide cream teas from the back of their car in a NT car park along the route. Arriving in Ludgvan we could see our destination clearly - St Michael's mount. We had a lovely meal and then a bit of a feedback session. It was strange to think that the last time I had been in that hall was when I came for interview there and that Nigel who was appointed has become a friend and inspiration. The CCW was his brainchild.

**Friday** a very gentle stroll over to St Michael's mount where we had a short service in the chapel then back to Marazion for pasty and another service. I grabbed a lift to the station and dozed on the train to Bodmin parkway where Janet met me.

It did indeed feel like a mini Camino with many echoes of the same. Quite a few of the pilgrims were contemplating doing the Camino and plied me with questions.
