Dear Friends,

Like many other people at this time of year, I have been reflecting on the topic of remembrance. November is the month for it, it seems, with the festival of All Saints hotly followed by All Souls and then Remembrance Day on the 11th of November, particularly poignant this year as it marks 100 years since the ending of World War 1. Remembrance is a vital part of our shared human experience. You only have to think of the tales that are often recounted whenever families and friends gather (and those which you wish would be forgotten!)

Christ himself called us to remember; his call is at the very heart of Christian worship. We are called to remember who God is and where God has been in our lives and in the whole of history. In that remembering we celebrate the gifts that we now enjoy and treasure; gifts of freedom, justice, peace and truth. The past that we remember allows us to value ever more deeply the present in which we live.

The final Sunday in the Christian year, also in November, celebrates the Kingship of Christ, honouring the King of Creation whose just and gentle rule is supreme. We are called to remember the coming of God's Kingdom, both 'now and not yet' when all are reconciled through God's mercy and grace. We are shown the King of the Cross as we celebrate the King of the Universe, Christ humiliated and Christ victorious. Responding to Christ's call to 'Do this in remembrance of me', we remember that we have to stay close to the humiliated and the victorious Christ, because we are called to live both in our own daily lives. Our prayer of thanksgiving for the past and the present demands our commitment to build a future that is rooted deeply in all we have celebrated by our remembering.
